Your Ministerial Search Committee (MSC) is pleased to provide you with another installment of News You Can Use—an update on what we've been up to.

What has the MSC been doing?

On April 17 our committee Chair, Shelley Nagrani, thanked all of the individuals and groups for the many contributions that made UUMAN an attractive congregation to prospective ministers. Shelley then announced the identity of our ministerial candidate. Dave Dunn!

Since then, your search committee has been arranging the schedule and logistics for candidating week, May 1-May 8. This is an opportunity for us to get to know our ministerial candidate and for this person to get to know us. In addition to preaching on both Sundays, the candidate will participate in a variety of events especially planned to help facilitate this getting-to-know-you process.

It is our goal to have as many congregants meet the candidate as is possible. We have scheduled a variety of events at different times of the day and at various venues to make it easy for people to attend. Please consider attending several events throughout the week. This is your chance to speak directly to the candidate, ask questions, and offer your thoughts about our congregation.

On May 8 there will be a congregational meeting to vote on ratifying the Search Committee's choice and extending the call to ministry to this candidate. As in any congregational meeting, there will need to be a quorum of members attending in order to hold the vote. This vote is a critical step in the search process as it demonstrates the congregation's commitment to the candidate. It is crucial to spend time getting to know the candidate during candidating week.
